## Lessons from the Life of Moses

Deuteronomy 34:10-12 “There has never been another prophet in Israel like Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face.<sup>11</sup> The Lord sent him to perform all the miraculous signs and wonders in the land of Egypt against Pharaoh, and all his servants, and his entire land.<sup>12</sup> With mighty power, Moses performed terrifying acts in the sight of all Israel.”

### Four Reasons to Study the Life of Moses

So the entire community and their livestock drank their fill.<sup>12</sup> But the Lord said to Moses and Aaron, “Because you did not trust me enough to demonstrate my holiness to the people of Israel, you will not lead them into the land I am giving them!”

IV. Similarities between the life of Moses and Jesus. Both . . .

Exodus 1:22 - 2:3 “Then Pharaoh gave this order to all his people: “Throw every newborn Hebrew boy into the Nile River. But you may let the girls live.” About this time, a man and woman from the tribe of Levi got married.<sup>2</sup> The woman became pregnant and gave birth to a son. She saw that he was a special baby and kept him hidden for three months.<sup>3</sup> But when she could no longer hide him, she got a basket made of papyrus reeds and waterproofed it with tar and pitch. She put the baby in the basket and laid it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile River.”

B. survived plots to kill them as infants

C. were raised by a man who wasn’t their father. Exodus 2:10

D. their ministries were born in the \_\_\_\_\_

Exodus 3: 1b-2, 10 Moses led the flock far into the wilderness and came to Sinai, the mountain of God.<sup>2</sup> There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a blazing fire from the middle of a bush. Moses stared in amazement. Though the bush was engulfed in flames, it didn’t burn up.<sup>10</sup> Now go, for I am sending you to Pharaoh. You must lead my people Israel out of Egypt.”
